Enclosed you will find everything you need for your placement audition. Based upon your audition, you will be placed into one of the following four jazz groups:

Jazz I

(Made up of the top players on campus)

Jazz II

(An intermediate group. Typically made up of some Seniors, But is mostly Juniors, Sophomores, and Freshmen)

Jazz III

(Designed to develop musical skills and prepare students for the more advanced ensembles.

Typically made up of Juniors and Sophomores but is mostly Freshmen)

Music auditions will take place after school on <u>May 6th</u>. "Make up auditions" are a possibility and can be scheduled by contacting Mr. Ragsdale ASAP. All <u>new</u> students interested in auditioning MUST attend the MANDATORY Parent Information Meeting <u>WITH A PARENT</u>.

*Remember, Jazz, concert band, and marching percussion have separate auditions.

Jazz Audition Requirements:

**Note: Do your best. If you can't play everything, or you are a complete beginner, you are still encouraged to audition. You will be placed in the best group that matches your abilities!

Wind players, Guitarists, Pianists and Mallet players should play the following:

- 1. All 12 Major scales (or as many as you know) in under 2 minutes.
- 2. The melody to the song **Apple Jump** (Sheet music provided. Slow tempo is ok!)
- 3. A jazz tune, etude, or transcription of your choice or an excerpt from a jazz band chart (Something you believe shows you at your best!)
 - Lead Trumpet Players: Consider showing your range with this excerpt.
- 4. Solo improvisation to the blues in F or Bb concert (to a recorded track that will be provided) **Optional, but required for Jazz 1**
- 5. Sight Reading (music will be provided at the audition)

Guitar and Piano Players: Demonstrate your knowledge of chord voicings on a ii-V-I chord progression in the keys of Bb and F

Bassists:

- 1. Play a walking bass line to the chord changes of a blues in Bb or F.
- 2. A jazz tune, etude, or transcription of your choice or an excerpt from a jazz band chart.
- 3. All 12 Major scales (or as many as you know) in under 2 minutes.
- 4. Sight Read (music will be provided at the audition)

Drummers play the following:

- 1. Swing time at quarter = 60, 120, & 240
- 2. Swing Time on Brushes = 120
- 3. Bossa Nova groove at 120, Samba groove at 240
- 4. Funk at 60
- 5. Rock groove at 120
- 6. Play with a recording on a song of your choice.
- 7. Sight Read (music will be provided at the audition)

Please read the attached rubric carefully – each component of the audition will be scored on a scale of 1-10 based on the rubric. Auditions will be scheduled in seven-minute time intervals.
