"A" Grade Effort Report

ASSIGNMENT: Research paper about the development, history, and evolution of your instrument.

FORMAT: Papers must be typed and double-spaced. Papers should be at least six pages in length (not counting title page and bibliography). Include your handwritten notes after the essay. A bibliography must be included after the notes.

SUPPLEMENTARY MATERIALS: Bibliography must follow MLA format, at least two different TYPES of sources for the research (internet, encyclopedia, book, periodical) must be used. YOU MAY NOT USE WIKIPEDIA. There are several music books in the school library that can help you. Your notes taken from source materials MUST BE INCLUDED. Do NOT copy the source material word for word. Only jot down facts you want to include and site your source.

DUE: Friday, December 6th, 2019. You may turn it in any time before then if you like.

GRADE: This will count for your "A" Grade Effort.

PURPOSE: To give students an opportunity to learn about their instrument.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS:

You will be graded on your use of capitalization, punctuation, sentence structure, organization and spelling. **Papers that are plagiarized will receive a grade of zero. Taking someone else's words and changing a few of them is still plagiarism.** Take notes on the material you want to include and create your paper from those notes. **You must turn in your notes or your paper will receive a grade of zero.** Just printing out web pages does not count. Notes must be written by you, not copied from the text.
